BIOLOGY 11 FIELD TRIP TO THE VANCOUVER **AQUARIUM**



On April 25th, Mr. Lamasan's Biology 11 students went to the Vancouver Aquarium to interact with live tidal pool sea animals from BC's marine invertebrate phyla and to explore the concepts of biodiversity and animal classification by examining key morphological characteristics and their development. They also learned about animal adaptations, habitats and interactions within ecosystems.

Although there is still much to be done over the final two months of the school year, it is also time to review student goals and plan programs for the upcoming school year. Some important items of note:

1) **Course Selection** - Grade 10 and 11 students should have already completed their course selection. However, you may have found that an LRC block cannot be chosen as a course in Powerschool. If your son or daughter is eligible for an LRC block, please select a placeholder course which can be switched out in place of a Learning Assistance Block later.

2) Exams - As usual, writing exams in Rooms 201/202 is open to students who have an Individual Education Plan and/or receive LRC services. Eligible students who have not written exams with the LRC in the past need to speak to Mr. Field to confirm a place.

3) **IEP Meetings -** A online booking form will be sent out to LRC parents shortly. Parents will have a choice of a 20 minute time slot on May 15, 16, 22, or 23. If you do not receive the email, please contact Mr. Field (mfield@aquinas.org) and we will arrange a time to connect about your child's Individual Education Plan.

ST. PIUS X CELEBRATES RETIREMENT


