SOCKS FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE

ongratulations to grade ten student Camden Hussey for his work in the Career Life Connections 10X class. When he embarked on his work experience/ experiential learning project, he decided to create a fundraising initiative.

He designed, sourced out a manufacturer and monogrammed 300 pairs of socks with the North Shore Rescue name on them. North Shore Rescue is defined on its website as "a volunteer community-based search and rescue Furthermore, he is another example team providing a life-saving service to the public, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year."

He began selling them at the base of community; there are many popular Grouse Mountain on the weekend of Saturday, May 11, 2019. The socks sell for \$15 per pair with 100 per cent of the profits going to North Shore Rescue for the organization to "sock away".

As a result of his work, he has earned media coverage in a recent issue of North Shore News, and increased awareness of the valuable role that North Shore Rescue has in the local community.


