

#### BC MINISTRY OF EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

#### **BC ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIPS**

BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province. The Ministry will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy 2004 Graduation Program requirements, including elective courses. Grad Transitions will not be included. A cumulative average percentage will be calculated and form the basis for determining winners, who receive a \$1250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. *Students do not apply for this scholarship*.

#### **BC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS**

There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners will have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and shown aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to use for post-secondary tuition. Only one student from each school may be nominated; therefore any 2018 grad wishing to be nominated by the school must submit a *Sponsorship Application Form*.

#### PATHWAY TO TEACHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship is awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated a commitment and aptitude for a career path in K-12 teaching. Winners receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to redeem when they are registered and attending an approved K-12 teacher education program at one of BC's nine Faculties of Education. *Deadline: February 15, 2018*.

#### DOGWOOD DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIPS

There are 5500 District/Authority Scholarships distributed across school districts and independent school authorities that recognize graduating B.C. students for excellence in their chosen area of interest or strength. Winners will receive a \$1250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition. These award acknowledge academics but also recognize a student's accomplishments in a number of fields:

- Indigenous Languages and Culture, demonstrated at school or in the community
- Fine Arts (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)

- **Applied Skills** (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
- Physical Activity (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
- International Languages with Integrated Resource Packages (IRPs) or External Assessments, including A.P. and I.B. courses
- Community Service (Volunteer Activity), which includes demonstration of local and global issues and cultural awareness
- **Technical and Trades Training** (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training)

Students can apply for this scholarship through the academic advisor's office.

## The Cinderella Project

he Cinderella Project is a federal charity comprised entirely of volunteers. The goal is to bring a little "Fairy Godmother" magic to high school graduates who are struggling to make ends meet and allow them to look forward to their graduation with anticipation and pride. They provide both young women and men with formal attire in which to attend their graduation festivities.

Each year, the Cinderella Project holds one "boutique day" where donations of clothing, shoes and accessories are distributed to the students referred to the project. Each student, with the personal assistance of a "fairy Godparent", selects a suit or gown of their choice. Shoes, accessories and

jewelry are also selected to complete the special outfit. The Cinderella Project boutique day is a way of celebrating the achievement of each student, many of whom have overcome personal hardships to reach the milestone of high school graduation. To make the day extra special The Pinnacle Hotel donates their ballroom for the occasion, hairstylists and makeup artists donate their time and there is even a disc jockey to set the mood. The Artona Group takes pictures of each grad and provides them with a photo package free of charge. Gift bags are also given to each student, which contain donations from many different sponsors.

## TRAFFIC NOTICE

Parents, your cooperation with managing drop-off and pick-up traffic before and after school is required.

We have two drop-off/pick up zones: one on the south side of West Keith Road, uphill from the bus stop, and one on the north side of West Sixth Street in front of the convent. These zones are signed for drop-off and pick-up during school hours on weekdays. You are permitted to pull in and drop off or pick up; you are not permitted to park and wait there.

We have asked parents not to enter the front parking lot of the school for drop-off or pick-up. This has caused problems for departing or arriving school buses, deliveries, and garbage collection. All of these involve large vehicles which require lots of clearance and space in which to turn. This includes drop-off and pick-up for after school activities such as games and practices.

We have also asked parents to be respectful of our neighbours with regards to parking. We have received complaints from neighbours on Delbruck Avenue and on West Sixth Street who report driveways being blocked, and in some cases, refusal to move when asked. We request your cooperation and assistance in maintaining good relations with our neighbours.

STA, as well as other schools in the lower mainland, participated in the Christmas Card for Inmates program again this year. This is one of the Prison Chaplain's responses:


