

UBC PHYSICS OLYMPICS

On Saturday, March 10th, nine grade 12 science students represented STA at the annual UBC Physics Olympics. With a total of 76 schools competing, it was the largest UBC Physics Olympics in recorded history! Accompanied by their team coach *Mr. Flores*, enthusiastic scientists *Zora Brough*, *John Choi, Ann Joby, Natasha Nock, Michael O'Keefe, David Onak, Jonathan Tubeo*, *Joshua Yellowley* and *Emilia Zerbe* took the Physics Olympics by storm! In advance of the big day, these students assembled an impressive piece of PVC engineering to hold a baking soda and vinegar ballistics reaction and a carefully crafted spinning top. While at the competition, the students worked on and answered Fermi questions and while the official

results have not yet been posted, our team is convinced that they did really well in this event. *Mr. Flores* commented that our students had a great time, and were very enthusiastic throughout the day. Even when things didn't go their way (such as when their ballistics assembly refused to fire), they always responded with humour and positivity. With attitudes like those, they are certainly ready for the world of university that awaits in just a few short months!



We are proud to announce that two of our senior science students, *Pablo Islas* and *Michael O'Keefe*, have been accepted to SHAD for the month of July. SHAD is an internationally-recognized summer program for elite students who are passionate about STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics), leadership, and making positive change in the world. *Pablo* will be attending SHAD at McGill University in Montreal, Quebec and *Michael* will be attending SHAD at Mount Allison in Sackville, New Brunswick. STA GYMNASTICS

he gymnastics team had 17 athletes qualify and compete at the Provincial Championships which were held on March 8,9, and 10 in Burnaby. The girls competed in 4 events each while the boys competed in Santiago Apostol earned 4 ribbons each. 6 events each. Ribbons are given out for the top 10 finishers in each individual event and then for top 10 overall in each level. The points are then added together and trophies are awarded for team placings.

With over 50 schools represented STA claimed three of the 8 trophies! The combined boys and girls team placed second in the province and were awarded a trophy. The boys (combined levels) team placed first and earned a trophy. The level 2 boys combined totals earned them a first place trophy.



There were many top 10 ribbons won by STA gymnasts. In level 1 boys, Ben Labreche and

Jonathan Ibbot earned 1 ribbon. The level 2 boys, Josh Gali, Oliver Radburn, and Jacob Nieckarz all earned 7 ribbons each. In level 3 Mattias Feigl-Schmidt earned 7 ribbons.

In level 1 junior girls *Grace Haines* earned 1 ribbon, as did Cara Bauermeister. In level 1 senior level Rachel Li earned 3 ribbons. Emily Hogan earned 4 ribbons and scored a perfect 10 for her floor routine, this was the only perfect score given out at provincials! In level 2 Amelia Hunt earned 4 ribbons. Chelsea Kim earned 1 ribbon, and Kiana Burran earned 1 ribbon. In level 5 Alexis Romero earned 5 ribbons.
