# BC Graduation Program

- Requires all students to successfully complete 80 credits in grades 10, 11, and 12, and write three provincial assessments: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10 and Literacy 12 assessments.
- There will be an opportunity for students to re-write the Provincial Graduation Assessments.
- Until graduation, students may write a Provincial Graduation Assessment up to three times: the original attempt and two re-writes.

# Considerations

- Consider starting at a smaller post-secondary school and benefit from much smaller classes, focus on teaching (not research), lower tuition, lower admission requirements, university transfer or full degree options, with a highly specialized and diversity of programs
- UBC reserves a full one third of their upper level seats in 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year classes for new transfer students

# Key Messages

- Universities will look at your grades in nearly ALL your academic Gr.11 and Gr.12 courses.
- Particular attention to courses related to what you want to study at university. If you have the course at both the Gr.11 and Gr.12 level, more emphasis will be placed on the Gr.12 grade.
- Be aware that having the highest grades is not the only way to get in – challenging yourself by taking a variety of courses or more rigorous courses can also be beneficial.

- The graduation requirements below are designated by a code number in the REQ column:

- 1 = Language Arts 10 (4 credits)\*
- 2 = Language Arts 11 (4 credits)
- 3 = Language Arts 12 (4 credits)
- 4 = Social Studies 10 (4 credits)
- 5 = Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- 6 = Mathematics 10 (4 credits)
- 7 = Mathematics 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- 8 = Science 10 (4 credits)
- 9 = Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- 10 = Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
- 11 = Arts Education and/or Applied Design, Skills and Technology 10, 11 or 12 (4 credits)
- 12 = Career Life Education (4 credits)
- 13 = Career Life Connections (4 credits)
- 15 = Literacy 10 Graduation Assessment
- 16 = Numeracy 10 Graduation Assessment
- 18 = Literacy 12 Graduation Assessment

\* If more than one course is designated as meeting requirement 1, then 2 credits from each course are being counted toward the requirement.

- In addition to the above 16 requirements, students need 28 credits for Elective Courses. Minimum 16 of 80 credits, including Language Arts 12, must be at the Grade 12 level.

- Never assume anything – you, your grades, your finances, your interests lots and lots of things will change by the time you are finishing grade 12

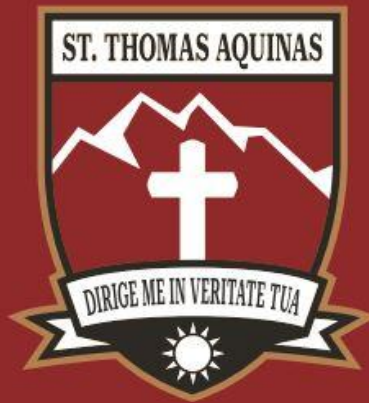
