Halloween Spirit Day & Haunted House - Thursday, October, 31

As we approach Halloween's fun and excitement, we want to ensure that the celebration remains respectful and in line with the values we hold as a school community. With that in mind, we have established a few guidelines to help students choose appropriate costumes:

• Modesty first: Costumes should be appropriate for a school environment. This means covering shoulders, midriff, and legs to a respectful length (i.e., no short skirts, shorts, or revealing tops). If you're unsure, it's best to err on the side of caution.

- Avoid offensive themes: Costumes should not include violent, gory, or inappropriate content, including weapons, blood, or anything disrespectful of others' cultures, religions, or beliefs.
- No masks or full face paint: Students' faces should be clearly visible for safety and identification. Light make up is fine, but full masks or extensive face paint that obscures identity are not allowed.
- School-appropriate accessories: Avoid props or accessories that could be disruptive or dangerous, such as toy weapons or overly large items.
- Respect for all: Costumes should reflect the values of our school community, avoiding themes that mock, belittle, or stereotype others.

If Administration deems a student's costume inappropriate, the student will be advised to go home, change and return to school.

For those participating in Spirit Day, students are required to donate a canned good or a minimum of \$2. Collections will be taken during first period. All proceeds from this day go to the STA Campus Ministry to supply food to the **Door is Open** and to St. Vincent de Paul Society. For those students who do not participate, full school uniform is required.

Students can enjoy the Haunted House organized by the Student Council, on the first floor. Participation warning: there will be flashing lights, a fog machine, smoke, and fake blood. Cost: \$2 (cash only).

All Soul's Day

<u>All Souls' Day</u> is also known as The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, which is **November 2**. This is a day of prayer for those who have died. Catholics are encouraged to pray for the faithful departed, to remember them, and to give thanks.
