Students will be responsible for putting away


their own tables and chairs when the awards presentation is over. Thank you to our many parent judges!

STA CAMPUS MINISTRY

STA Chapel Icons #5 of 12 - Nicholas Black Elk (1863 – 1950)

Black Elk was a wičháša wakňáŋ (medicine man, holy man) of the Oglala Lakota people. He was born in December 1863 along the Little Powder River (at a site thought to be in the present-day state of Wyoming). According to the Lakota way of measuring time (referred to as Winter counts), Black Elk was born in 'the Winter When the Four Crows Were Killed on Tonque River'. Black Elk came from a long lineage of medicine men and healers in his family. His father was a medicine man, as were his paternal uncles.

Black Elk converted to Catholicism in 1904. He was christened with the name of Nicholas and later served as a catechist in the church, teaching others about Christianity, but he also continued to practice Lakota ceremonies. This icon was written (painted) honouring his age, wisdom, and holiness. He is depicted



wearing his familiar buckskin shirt, with no ornamentation and with the front leather lacing. Wearing a Lakota blanket around his waist, he holds one of his pipes in his left hand, while in the act of reciting the rosary with his right.

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Rapid City opened an official cause for his beatification within the Roman Catholic Church in 2016. His grandson, George Looks Twice said, 'He was comfortable praying with this pipe and his rosary, and participated in Mass and Lakota ceremonies on a regular basis'.
