The Door Is Open - Sunday, March 2

The <u>Door Is Open</u> is a Catholic Charities outreach service that provides meals and services to residents and transients in the Vancouver's eastside. Students prepare and serve a meal to those living on the downtown eastside while earning service hours. The school bus will depart from STA on **Sunday, March 2** at **9:00am** and return at approximately 1:30pm. Uniforms are not required. Students must register and submit a permission form with the Campus Ministry office by Thursday, February 27. Spots are limited!

STA Chapel Icons #9 of 12 -Anne-Marie Martel (1644-1673)

Born in the town of Le Puy-en-Velay in the heart of France. Anne-Marie Martel's life was one of devotion, compassion, and unwavering commitment to serving the less fortunate. At the tender age of 23, her path took an unexpected turn when her Bishop entrusted her with the task of teaching catechism to impoverished women at a hospital for the destitute and to homeless children wandering the streets. Little did she know that this act of kindness would ignite a spark that would illuminate the lives of countless individuals. Inspired by Anne-Marie's selfless dedication and her burning desire to serve God through loving the poor, other women soon flocked to her side, eager to join her in this sacred mission. Together, they formed a sisterhood bound by faith, compassion, and an unshakable resolve to uplift the downtrodden. Tragically, Anne-Marie died on January 15,



1673, when she passed away at the young age of 28. Yet, even in death, her legacy lived on, for unbeknownst to her, she had sown the seeds of a vibrant community of religious women. This congregation, which came to be known as the Sisters of the Child Jesus, carried Anne-Marie's torch of compassion forward, touching countless lives along the way. Decades later, from 1959 to 1976, it was this order of sisters who would largely staff St. Thomas Aquinas High School.
