

**Canyon Trip** 

The Physical Geography 12 class trip adventure began with a 6:00 am arrival time at the Vancouver airport. After clearing US customs without a hitch and landing in Phoenix, Arizona at 1PM, a quick lunch stop at In and Out Burger set us up for our travel to Sedona. In Sedona we hiked Airport Mesa and watched the sunset before checking in at our hotel for a quiet evening in anticipation of our big travels the next day.

Friday morning, shortly into our drive to see the Grand Canyon, we stopped to visit local Navajo Artists and see Oak Creek Canyon. At 11am we arrived at the Grand Canyon and boarded the bus to South Kaibab Trailhead. 
